A field trip was conducted to gain first-hand knowledge from the classroom to a factory, farm, geological area, or environment of certain plant species (https://www.merriam-webster.com). A one-day field trip was taken to Thangching Herbals Enterprises, Bungmual, Forest Pick, Chengkongpang and Aichin park at Mata village, Churachadnpur Manipur. Essential oil from lemon grass is commonly used as a fragrance in perfumes and cosmetics, such as creams and soaps. (Wifek et al., 2016). In Thangching Herbals Enterprises, lemon grass was extracted from the plant Cymbopogon flexuosus for various purposes, including room freshener, tea leaves, phenyl, medicine (to regulate blood pressure, asthma), essential oil and incense stick. Tea is the most common beverage consumed after water. Tea is found to be antimicrobial, antioxidant, anti-inflammatory and anti-carcinogenic, which has beneficial effects on human health (Soni et al., 2015). One significant tea leaf production in Lamka town is the Forest Pick factory. The tea leaves produced from this include green tea leaves, black tea leaves, smoke tea leaves, wild galangal black tea leaves, flavoured tea leaves, wild tea leaves, white tea leaves and colong tea leaves, which are plucked in the wild forest of Thanlon Sub-Division, Churachandpur, Manipur. The herbarium is linked to many fields of study, including morphology, taxonomy, ethnobotany, pharmacology, biochemistry, cytology, genetics, molecular biology, material science, ecology, conservation, plant pathology, plant breeding and physiology. This report is the outcome of our field trip to Thangching Herbals Enterprises, Forest Pick factory and Aichin Park.

The primary objectives of the field trip was to study the process of extraction of lemon grass essential oil and their by-products, document the different varieties of tea leaves processing, study plant diversity and collect the plant's specimen for the Herbarium.

MATERIALS AND METHODS:






